Dear Mrs Brown,

After a long stay in Australia we have now moved north to continue our mission. Our outfit is in fine shape and I feel confident that we will give the enemy a greater punch than we did before.

Your letter reached me yesterday; asking about the story of the "unknown private" that made a great ~~combat~~ ^{come back} in the Buna campaign. You

can use any information in
any of the letters I have sent.
I realize how unprepared I am
to put these stones in a
correct form but I will
strive to do my best - hoping
and praying that will give
praise and glory to Christ
and His Kingdom, for with-
out Him, I am nothing.

I am mailing a group
of official photographs of
the fighting in New Guinea.
Maybe, you might be able
to use some of them in
your book. As I write

about these different incidents
I can refer you to some
of the pictures you find
in this magazine. I have
labeled the one about the
japanese in the barge,
so you might get a better
picture of what I was
trying to say.

I have had a personal
christmas card printed with
a christmas message to my
friends. On this I have
another little story you
might be able to use.
I'll send you one as soon

as they reach, some from the
printers. "Singapore etc in certain
printers."

I'm enclosing a ^{study} copy of
the outline of a group of
rescue programs that I
had the ~~privilege~~ ^{experience} of conducting
a few months before I
left Australia. It was a
great opportunity for me
to talk to the men
about their spiritual
life and what it could
mean to them in battle.

Let me know what
you think about the
procedures.
