## Information for Applicants to PCSP:



- PCAT test dates and registration deadlines are available online at [www.pcatweb.info](http://www.pcatweb.info). You may also register online at this website.
- The latest PCAT test score accepted for the 2010 admissions cycle is January, 23, 2010. PCAT scores from the January test are not remitted to PCSP until mid-March, therefore if you want your January PCAT score used to evaluate your application you MUST request that your file be held and evaluation delayed until after the January PCAT scores are received. Please be aware that requesting a hold on your file will delay consideration for admission.



- To access PharmCAS log onto [www.pharmacas.org](http://www.pharmacas.org). All applicants must submit their PharmCAS application prior to submitting the Supplemental Application. Once a PharmCAS application is submitted, applicants will be emailed the link for the PCSP supplemental application.
- PharmCAS requires that students applying to the first class of a new pharmacy school apply to at least one other school with accreditation status with ACPE. ACPE will make the decision as to whether or not to grant pre-candidate status to PCSP in January 2010. Once a school has received pre-candidate status, the stipulation enforced by PharmCAS to apply to more than one pharmacy school will no longer apply. ## Accreditation Update:

PCSP has achieved its first accreditation milestones!

- SACS approved Presbyterian College's application for substantive change on June 26.
- On June 29, ACPE approved an on-site visit for the fall. The site visit with ACPE is scheduled for October 13–15, 2009. The site team will present their findings to ACPE and the council will make the decision of whether or not to grant Pre-candidate status to PCSP at their annual meeting in January.
