## Applying for Admission:

Presbyterian College reviews applications for transfer admission on a rolling basis. The sooner you submit your complete application, the sooner the Admission Committee can render a decision to you.

## Transfer of Credit:

Your college transcripts serve as our primary source for a complete list of courses taken and courses in progress. The Registrar's Office will review your transcript(s) and determine which credits will transfer to PC. For dual enrolled credits while in high school, a college transcript must be submitted for review.

## Please Note:

You must have a grade of C - or better for a course to be considered for transfer of credit.

Transfer credit may be granted for courses which correspond to or are the equivalent of courses offered by Presbyterian College

Courses which do not correspond to courses offered by PC may be accepted as free electives.

Up to seventy-four (74) semester hours may be transferred.

Transfer students must complete the general education requirements that apply to the year in which they entered Presbyterian College.
