

Intramural Eligibility Rules & General Information

Team Captains agree to ensure the compliance of all members of their team.

Whenever a specific case is reported to the intramural staff, an investigation will be performed to determine whether the person in question is eligible.

1) Team Eligibility

- a. The captain must submit an entry form with the names & signatures of all players who will compete in the intramural sport. This becomes the official team roster.
- b. Players can be added to the roster until the first game is played.
- c. Once a player has participated in one game for a team in any activity, he/she may not switch to another team.
- d. Team fees vary by sport please see Director of Student Involvement for any questions.

2) Individual Eligibility

- a. All current students, faculty, and staff of PC are eligible to participate in the intramural program.
- b. All players must sign a Waiver of Liability before participation.
- c. No player may participate on more than one team in the same sport.
- d. All team members must be on the team roster to play.
- e. A team forfeits any contest in which an ineligible player was used.
- f. Varsity athletes are not eligible to participate in the sport the athlete has received a scholarship for or participated in, until 1 year after their last team eligibility.
- g. Varsity athletes in any league may be required to play in the A league, at the discretion of the Director of Student Involvement or his/her designee

3) Rescheduling

- a) Games will only be rescheduled at the discretion of the Director of Student Involvement and/or his/her designee
- b) Games rescheduled due to inclement weather will be reschedule for the following Sunday or the next open game time
- c) In the event that other unforeseeable events arise, at the discretion of the Director of Student Involvement and his/her designee, games will be rescheduled and changes will be communicated via email to team captains

4) Misconduct

- a. Any player or captain whose conduct and/or language is considered threatening to other players, officials, spectators, or supervisors will be referred to the director of student involvement. The offending individual must meet with the director to review and discuss the incident and any potential disciplinary action, before returning to play. The staff members will consult with eyewitnesses, including intramural staff, to get additional information. If gross misconduct is found, the offending individual loses the privilege to compete in intramural program and may face college disciplinary action.

5) Play off determination

- a. First by win/loss ratio
- b. Second by point differential (total number of points in victory – total number of points in loss)

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Intramural Spectator/Non-sports participant Policies

Anyone is welcome to attend intramural sporting events. By attending these intramural events, the spectators must follow the policies listed in the Code of Responsibility, the Honor Code, and the specific policies listed below:

- 1) Abide by the policies included in Code of Responsibility and in the Honor Code
- 2) Respect the instruction of intramural staff
- 3) Abstain from interrupting the intramural sporting events and officiating process
- 4) Remain off of the area(s) of intramural competition include designated fields, courts, etc. while game is currently in play
- 5) Alcohol is prohibited at all intramural events, all intramural events are dry events
- 6) Dispose trash in designated receptacles
