CURRICULUM AND DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

The curriculum of the Doctoral Occupational Therapy Program at Presbyterian College replicates the science and theory-base of the profession, enabling student growth and understanding towards skilled intervention and approaches unique to occupational therapy.

The program is 33 months in duration, or 8 semesters. It comprises 113 credit hours in a mix of didactic/experiential courses (83 credits), clinical education/fieldwork (28 credits), and required programmatic competency (2 credits).

Course topics include:

- Foundational courses that include Anatomy & Physiology, Neurology, Kinesiology, Development, Cognition, & Motor Analysis.
- Occupational therapy courses introduce skills, evaluation, techniques covering the lifespan and practice settings, including courses in community mobility, environmental adaptation, mental health, work/ vocational rehabilitation, health promotion, children and youth.
- Advanced courses help transition students to management, leadership, and academic roles, while developing research and program development skills within the community and the profession of occupational therapy.

ACCREDITATION

The Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE®) is committed to the establishment, promotion, and evaluation of standards of quality in occupational therapy education to ensure effective preparation of competent entry-level occupational therapists. The PC-OTD Program received ACOTE Candidacy Status in August 2020.
