English Immersion Program Winter 2015

Located on a beautiful 240-acre campus between two major cities in South Carolina, the heart of the Southeast, Presbyterian College (PC) offers a unique cultural experience. The English Immersion Program allows international students to not only improve their English skills but to also explore a historic part of the United States.

Why take a pre-term winter course?

Languages thrive in a culture, not simply in a classroom. PC's 4-week English Immersion Program (EIP) helps students acclimate to conversational English and daily life in American culture before they begin their university program.

Participants will have the chance to learn and practice effective communication skills in an intimate, student-focused environment. They will explore a remarkable area of the country and build meaningful relationships with PC faculty and American students.

Instruction

The program is designed to raise students' English competency and introduce them to the academic skills expected of American university students. It includes 60 hours of classroom instruction, as well as extensive conversation sessions. The small class size provides an excellent setting for discussion. In addition, students learn valuable research methods and are able to attend a variety of lectures from exceptional faculty.

Accommodation

Program participants will be provided with on-campus university housing at Presbyterian College. They will also be provided with an ID card that can be used at the dining halls for their daily meals. On Excursions, participants will have to pay for their own meals.

In addition to weekly trips, the program includes regional excursions. Some of the places EIP participants have visited in the past include Greenville and Charleston in South Carolina, Asheville in the mountains of North Carolina, and Washington, D.C.

Application Requirements

To apply, students must be currently enrolled in an undergraduate institution.

Note: Students participating in the EIP who plan to enroll at Presbyterian College will have further PC language requirements waived for the following school year.

Program Dates and Deadlines

The 4-week EIP will run from January 11- February 6, 2015, and include a final optional trip to Washington, D.C.

The deadline to apply for this program is November 15, 2014.

The overall fee for the program is \$2,500(US). This fee includes:

- 4 weeks of instruction
- Accommodation and some meals
- All activities and excursions
- Airport pick-up service
- Library and computer lab access
- · Access to on-campus gym, sports fields, & laundry facilities
